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- Roll Call

The State Civil Service Commission convened its monthly general business meeting at 9:09 a.m. on Wednesday, September 2, 2026. Present were Chairman Stewart Gentry, Vice Chairman D. Scott Hughes, Commissioners Candes Carter, Thomas Grimstad, Craig Netteville, Jo Ann Nixon, and Codi Plaisance.

- Opportunity for Public Comment (No Attachment)
No requests received from the public to address the commission.

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- 1) Consideration of the **Minutes** of the Commission meeting held July 1, 2026. **On motion duly made by Vice Chairman Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Nixon and unanimously passed, the Commission voted to adopt the meeting minutes from July 1, 2026.**
 - 2) In accordance with Article X Section 12 of the Louisiana State Constitution, consideration of adopting a resolution to appoint Olivia Marchand of the State Civil Service Appeals Division as a referee. The appointment empowers the referee to hear and decide any appeal that is pending before the State Civil Service Commission on July 6, 2026, as well as any appeal filed thereafter. **On motion duly made by Vice Chairman Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Nixon and unanimously passed, the Commission voted to adopt the resolution to appoint Olivia Marchand of the State Civil Service Appeals Division as a referee.**

At the request of Director Decoteau, item #22 was the first of the agency requests to be heard on the agenda.

- 22) Request of the **Department of Children and Family Services** to establish an Incentive Pay Policy for Child Welfare and Child Support Enforcement employees, in accordance with State Civil Service Rule 6.16(d), effective January 1, 2027, through December 31, 2027. **Christopher Baum, Undersecretary of the Department of Children and Family Services, provided a presentation to the Commission and answered questions regarding the proposed Incentive Pay Policy. On motion duly made by Vice Chairman Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Grimstad and unanimously passed, the Commission voted to grant the request of the Department of Children and Family Services to establish an Incentive Pay Policy for Child Welfare and Child Support Enforcement employees, in accordance with State Civil Service Rule 6.16(d), effective January 1, 2027, through December 31, 2027. Also, as recommended by State Civil Service, the agency will report on the use of the Incentive Pay policy to the Commission at the conclusion of the policy's term.**

- 3) **Public Hearing** to consider proposed changes to the Classification and Pay Plan (Details contained in General Circular Number 2026-043.)
- Public comments

The Commission conducted a public hearing to consider proposed changes to the Classification and Pay Plan and provided opportunity for public comments, to which there were none. Janelle Haynsworth, Compensation Program Manager, presented the proposed changes as published in General Circular 2026-043. Ms. Haynsworth informed the Commission of one comment received from a DOTD Program Specialist 5 who expressed concern that the pay level for that job will remain the same.

On motion duly made by Commissioner Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Netterville and unanimously passed, the Commission voted to approve the pay plan proposals for Exhibits A and B, being contingent upon gubernatorial approval.

On motion duly made by Commissioner Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Netterville and unanimously passed, the Commission voted to approve Exhibits C and D, contingent upon gubernatorial approval of Exhibits A and B.

Also, the Commission granted authority to the State Civil Service Director to set the effective date no sooner than 10 days following gubernatorial approval.

- 4) **Public Hearing** to consider proposed changes to chapters 3, 6, and 10 of the Civil Service Rules. (Details contained in General Circular Number 2026-042.)
- Public Comments

Sherri Gregoire, General Counsel, presented the proposed amendments to the Commission as published in General Circular Number 2026-042. Director Decoteau informed the Commission of one comment received from Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana in response to the proposal that was included in their meeting binder.

After providing opportunity for public comments, to which there were none, on motion duly made by Commissioner Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Netterville and unanimously passed, the Commission voted to approve the change to Civil Service Rule 3.1.

After providing opportunity for public comments, to which there were none, on motion duly made by Commissioner Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Netterville and unanimously passed, the Commission voted to approve the change to Civil Service Rule 6.10(d).

After providing opportunity for public comments, to which there were none, on motion duly made by Commissioner Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Nixon and unanimously passed, the Commission voted to approve the change to Civil Service Rules 10.2 and 10.6(b), as discussed.

 - **DOTD Cameron Ferry Update:** The Department has been advised by DOTD that the Cameron Ferry Contract, which the Commission approved in draft form earlier this year subject to non-substantive changes, is nearing completion.
 - Consideration of a motion to *recess/adjourn* for Executive Session to consider Applications for Review of Civil Service Appeals, discuss Personnel Matters and consider formal charges. (All Commissioners to verbally vote.)
